## Historic Water Settlement on Hold for Poudre River Headwaters

Parties call Forest Service decision a "missed opportunity"



A settlement to one of Colorado's longest-running water disputes - and the opportunity to launch the largest native trout restoration in Colorado's history - was dealt a blow by the Forest Service's refusal to accept a

collaborative arrangement for funding the project. Colorado Trout Unlimited (CTU) and the Water Supply and Storage Company (WSSC) last year agreed to settle a long-standing dispute regarding how best to address environmental impacts of the Long Draw Reservoir in the Cache la Poudre headwaters. But the Forest Service on Sept. 3 rejected the cost-sharing arrangement at the heart of the proposal. *"The good news is that the Forest Service, WSSC, and CTU all agreed that restoring native trout in the Poudre headwaters is the right approach to mitigating Long Draw's impacts,"* said David Nickum, Executive Director of CTU. *"The bad news is that the Forest Service rejected a carefully crafted proposal that had allowed stakeholders to find common ground after more than 10 years of legal battles. This is a huge missed opportunity."*
