St. Pete's Corner


It's February already and the days just keep rolling by...fast. It's too bad there's not a sick note for cabin fever because the cases really shot through the roof this week! There are lots of people tying and going to fish local tailwaters; class attendance has been awesome; and the turn out for the movie second movie night at Odell Brewing Co was amazing-thank you to everyone who attended. It never disappoints to see the strong, diverse community that we have built together. It's great to see support from everyone and it's always so fun for me when we can all be in the same room together. It's a positive energy that we all enjoy and if we continue to work together then our community only becomes stronger. With the profits going



towards RMFC's Summer Youth Camp, we can now welcome in the next generation of anglers and pass the torch to them by teaching good habits, etiquette, technique, and ethics while on the water.

With winter present, we all know how technical fishing can be. I fished the North Fork of the Poudre River at Gateway Natural Area last Monday and even with low flows and picky trout, fishing was still a blast. I encourage you all to check out The North Fork or Big Thompson tailwaters before winter ends. Come readily stocked with a couple of each pattern in each sized Zebra midges #22-24, Bling Midges #22-24, and Biot Midge Emergers in a #20-22. For Blue Winged Olive Nymphs I would personally take Beadless Pheasant Tails #20-22, and Juju Baetis in Black #20-22. I prefer nymphing these on 5x-6x fluorocarbon this time of year but when dealing with larger fish you might want something stronger like 4x. These flies are also weightless so have JP's Tungsten Nymphing Putty ready to go. This stuff allows me to make really small weight adjustments. I set my flies up about 1-1.5 feet away from each other and cycle through patterns, weight, and depth every 3-5 drifts until I find out what the fish want.

Most of the time I will be fishing deep pools and deep runs but on a sunny day you might see fish spread out. If you are seeing lanes of bubbles and foam on the surface this can be a good indication of food below the surface and there is a good chance that fish will be there munching. Start at the bottom of your run, cast upstream into the seams of said run, let the drift come back down, pick up, and re-cast further out into the run or take 2 steps upstream and make another presentation. This will allow you to cover water in great detail which will help get flies in front of more fish. I always have Adams in a #20-24 and Eric's Hi-Vis Midges #20-22 in the event of a hatch. If I see fish beginning to rise or bugs flying around I will take off my nymph rig, add 5-6x mono to my leader and fish the seams and foam-lines with dry flies. It doesn't happen often but when it does, it can be pretty awesome. Keep it simple. From how you rig your flies to how you work the water. If you do get caught up with questions, come find me at St.Pete's Old Town and I will help you figure it out. I hope everyone has a good month and just remember, spring is on the way.


