project to assist with the restoration of the section of the North Fork of the Cache La Poudre River that runs through the <u>Larimer County Eagle's Nest Open Space</u>. Volunteers are needed on September 25th and October 30th for our annual trail maintenance days at <u>Eagle's Nest</u>. Larimer County provides the appropriate tools. ## Rainbow Re-Establishment CDOW Research Experiment



In mid-August, about 35 CDOW aquatic biologists and staff from across Colorado along with 26 volunteers from the Rocky Mountain Flycasters Chapter of Trout Unlimited participated in what many describe as one of the largest research experiments that CDOW has ever

conducted. Prior to the emergence of whirling disease, the Poudre supported self-sustaining populations of both rainbow and brown trout in the ratios of about 60% rainbow and 40% brown trout. Whirling disease decimated the population of rainbows to the extent that today's trout population is predominantly brown trout. As a result, many trout anglers who were attracted by the excitement of leaping rainbows on a tight line have been deprived of those thrills. CDOW's goal is to re-establish a sizable selfsustaining population of rainbows, in addition to the existing brown trout population, thereby again making the Poudre a more attractive fishery for the angling public by having more balanced populations of both trout species. ## RMF Youth Day Camp a Success! Dennis Cook, RMF Youth Outreach Chairman



RMF's inaugural NoCO Youth Conservation & Fly Fishing Day Camp in July was a success by all accounts based on responses from campers and parents. Following a last minute cancellation by a 10th camper, we proceeded with nine, enthusiastic youths' ages 14-15; two girls and seven boys. Six camp-days later they had completed extensive conservation ethics & issues studies and a willowsrestoration project on the Big T, as well as experiencing classroom and generous on-water fly fishing skills training. Conservation studies generally occupied the initial couple days, transitioning into a mix with fly fishing for the next couple, and fly fishing skills generally occupied the last couple days. Curriculum time was pretty evenly balanced between conservation and fishing. All of our river fishing was on the Poudre, and we also fished the Lower Valley ponds at Sylvan Dale.

Many RMF members generously volunteered their time and talents, and with a couple non-members we totaled 23 volunteers. This was terrific, because it enabled the campers to receive 1:1 skills instruction and mentoring, which resulted in every camper catching fish on both still and river waters.

Additionally, we were supported by 19 professional staff from the CDOW, NRCS, TU, CTU and Timberline Aquatics, Inc. who presented classroom material, led the willows planting and several on-water activities, and also handled the entomology sessions.

We also are fortunate to have partnered with the Larimer Boys & Girls Club which provided transportation vehicles and drivers in exchange for some members on scholarship and agreement for RMF to present some fly fishing related classes for their other member youths. We look forward to continuing this relationship in coming years.
