

The fight to defend the Colorado River from irreparable harm to the trout fishery in the reaches downstream from Windy Gap Reservoir moved into a new stage on January 26 when a robust crowd of river advocates participated in a rally sponsored by Trout Unlimited. The rally was at the front door of the Environmental Protection Agency office in downtown Denver. The purpose of the rally was to deliver to the EPA the petitions signed by all those who supported the Defend the Colorado campaign. For all of our readers who joined the Defend the Colorado campaign, our thanks for your support. A decision as to what mitigation actions are to be taken to preserve, and hopefully improve the Colorado River is now in the hands of the EPA.

Project Healing Waters Fly Fishing

Greetings, my name is Bruce Peck, I live in Windsor, Colorado. Many of you are aware that there are numerous volunteer organizations that have been started, particularly during the past ten years, that strive to help disabled veterans heal from physical and mental wounds they have that resulted from their military service, both combat and non-combat related. One organization that is doing that on the national level is <u>Project Healing Waters Fly Fishing</u> (PHWFF). Project Healing Waters Fly Fishing, Inc. is a non-profit organization dedicated to the physical and emotional rehabilitation of disabled active military service personnel and veterans through fly fishing and fly tying education and outings. PHWFF currently has 105 programs in 38 states. Each program is managed at the local level by volunteers and based at a Department of Veterans Affairs (DVA) facility, Department of Defense (DoD) military installation, or other location. PHWFF has 14 geographic regions throughout the United States.

My co-lead, Chris Lamson, and I are now in the process of establishing a PHWFF program here in the Fort Collins/Northern Colorado area. We recently secured permission from the Cheyenne VA Medical Center and the Fort Collins VA Clinic to work through them to establish a program, and now we are attempting to gather volunteers and establish a program schedule to offer to interested disabled vets in the area. PHWFF programs are associated with and draw volunteers from Federation of Fly Fishers clubs (39 clubs), Trout Unlimited chapters (40 chapters), and independent clubs (24 independent clubs). Program Leads from PHWFF coordinate with DVA and DoD employees to plan and administer the fly fishing program in accordance with the provisions set forth by PHWFF and the DoD and VA facilities' requirements. A Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) is signed by PHWFF and an interested fly fishing club to formalize a relationship. As we progress, we greatly welcome RMF TU

Chapter affiliation and individual volunteers willing to be involved with the program, including teaching courses, casting lessons, possibly fly tying classes, and helping with fishing trips when we get to that stage. This is a great opportunity to help those who served our country and paid a heavy price, and to introduce them to fly fishing, which we all have a passion for and already understand what a great form of recreation and "therapy" fly fishing is. Fly fishing is an activity that can greatly help these wounded warriors lead a better life.

We are excited to start a program here in Northern Colorado and hope that many of you will be interested in helping. Please check out the website for more information, and anyone who would like to volunteer their time and skills can contact your local program leads, me via <a href="mailto:emai

Chapter members are requested and encouraged to step forward and volunteer to become members of RMF's Chapter Board of Trustees by contacting one of the four Nominations Committee members listed below. Members are also encouraged to refer names of other members who they believe may be willing to consider serving on the Board. While some leadership experience can be helpful, most important is that persons be interested in RMF's success, enthusiastic about current or possible new programs or other chapter forms of progress, and supportive of Trout Unlimited's conservation mission.

Our seven-person Chapter Board of Trustees consists of Officers (President, Vice President, Treasurer & Secretary), Immediate Past President and two Trustees-At-Large. All positions stand for re-election annually at our May annual membership meeting. The names of nominees are required to be posted on the RMF website no less than ten days before the May meeting date. Further nominations can be made from the floor during the annual meeting election process.

All Trustees positions are elected annually to one-year terms. The President may be re-elected for three successive one year terms, and all other positions are re-electable for unlimited successive terms. It is desirable for 'new blood' to be regularly introduced onto the Board along with existing members. This enables more members to become familiar with chapter matters and brings new perspectives and ideas into Board discussions and decisions, helping the Board to remain faithful to membership preferences.
