SURVEY RESULTS: CHARACTERISTICS AND VIEWS OF RMF MEMBERS AND SUPPORTERS



An exceptional number of Rocky Mountain Flycasters Flypaper subscribers (n=192) responded to our invitation to provide feedback by participating in an online Flypaper survey conducted between May 21 and June 4. The results revealed that a majority of RMF members perceive their chapter as maintaining a 50%-50% emphasis balance between fishing and conservation and want to see this emphasis maintained as RMF move into its fourth decade of existence as a Trout Unlimited Chapter. JUNE CONSERVATION NOTES

Enjoy a 5-day back-country campout with Chris Kennedy next week

Chris is the U S Fish & Wildlife Service biologist assigned to Rocky Mountain National Park. His field season for trout research in the Park's back-country is now underway. It began this week at Haynach Lakes just west of the Continental Divide and continues there next week. He is still in need of assistance from July 14 through July 18. This two-week project is a mark-recapture population estimate on Haynach Lakes, altitude about 11,000 feet. During this week of July 7 through 11, Chris and his volunteers are capturing fish from the lake by hook-and-line, marking them with a fin clip, and returning them to the lake.

Chris describes next week's action: "We will continue with marking of fish during the first part of the 2nd week, July 14 through 18, and at the end of the 2nd week we will conduct net surveys on the lake. Based on the number of marked fish versus un-marked fish that are captured in the nets, we can obtain a population estimate for the lake. This will be a backpack trip and we will stay at the Haynach llama campsite which is

7.2 miles from the trailhead with a 2000 foot elevation gain. Haynach Lake is a mile with a 320 foot elevation gain from the campsite."

Volunteers will be responsible for all their own gear; camping, food, fishing, rain, etc. The lake is pretty open along the shore for casting so waders are not necessarily needed, but if people want to bring them to get further out into the lake they must first be disinfected to prevent spread of disease and invasive species.

If you can join Chris on Monday next week, send an email to Austin Condon at <u>AWCFlash @ aol.com</u>, telling him so, and he will let Chris know you will join him on Monday, July 14. Austin will then send you directions as to where and when to meet Chris.

If you are already booked for something else next week, remember it is just the start of Chris' fieldwork. Other destinations coming up include: a trout population survey at Lake Husted July 21 thru 25; and August 4 thru 8, fish surveys at Mirror Lake and Cascade Creek, both accessed off Highway 14 and Long Draw Road.

This Draft, http://www.fcgov.com/naturalareas/pdf/draft-master-plan6-14.pdf, is open for comments from the public through July19. The contents of the Draft encompass many subjects associated with Natural Areas. Of strong interest to our readers is the section addressing the Cache la Poudre River. This writer's perusal of the Draft revealed a welcome and comprehensive set of goals to sustain and improve the urban reach of the Poudre. Our readers are encouraged to read the Daft and then send comments using the form at http://www.surveygizmo.com/s3/1689709/Natural-Areas-Master-Plan-Comment-Form The Master Plan will only be adopted if City Council perceives sufficient public support for it, and that means adding your voice by using this comment form.
