

GRATITUDE FOR SUCCESSFUL CONSERVATION PROJECTS IN 2014

Although we had fewer projects than usual in 2014, the turnout and enthusiasm of the volunteers for those projects was extraordinary.

As the year draws to a close, I want to express my sincere gratitude to all who participated, and also to those who wanted to take part but had schedule conflicts that kept you away. I look forward with optimism that 2015 will include more onstream projects on both the Big Thompson and the Poudre.

My optimism stems from two bright lights within the tunnel that leads to the New Year.

One is that funds from the Federal Department of Urban Development are on the way to Colorado for applications

involving stream restorations resulting from both flood and wildfire disasters.


The other bright light is that the Coalition for the Poudre River Watershed, is moving ahead with restoration of the Skin Gulch tributary that deposited enormous amounts of silt and debris into the Poudre near Stove Prairie Road during the 2013 floods. Many hours of volunteers devoted to& planting willows, plus native grasses and plants will be needed to complete this project.


