

Open House on City's Approach to Northern Integrated Supply Project

The public, and especially this newsletter's readers, are invited to learn about, and provide your inputs regarding the Northern Integrated Supply Project (NISP) at an Open House, Monday, February 13, 5-7 p.m. at the Lincoln Center's Columbine Room, 417 West Magnolia, Fort Collins. The open house will provide information about a proposal by City staff that would allow staff to explore the potential for negotiated outcomes with Northern Colorado Water Conservancy District. Northern is the NISP project proponent. At its February 21 meeting, Fort Collins City Council will be considering staff's recommendation. You might also want to attend the City Council meeting, but the open house will be personally inter-active and responsive to your questions.

The proposed NISP project has a long and contentious history. Its basic purpose is to divert infrequent high flows from the Poudre during Springtime


months, and store the diverted water in a new reservoir to be constructed near Ted's Place on route 287. Later, the stored water would be distributed via new pipelines, to 15 water suppliers in northern Colorado communities, as their water users continue to grow in population. This diversion of water before the river's in-stream flows reach downtown Fort Collins, would destroy the natural beauty and highly valued recreation resource that now exists along the urban reach of the Poudre.

Recently, Northern Water has proposed a different flow management pattern that, over a 12-mile long river channel from near Ted's place downstream to approximately Timnath, would keep substantial flows in-river during run-off months and also during other months maintain low flows somewhat greater than currently occur.

If this sounds complicated (it is) that's the reason to attend the open house at Lincoln Center on February 13,5 PM to 7 PM.
