Vince Herrera's St. Peter's Fly Fishing Report for July



As we segway into the month of July we have seen our local waters go through their annual stages of run off. Water is beginning to fall back down to desirable wading levels and clarity has cleared up from the chocolate milk we were all seeing a while back.

Due to the rules and regulations put in place, the river is your new favorite hangout spot. Although water is still high we have been seeing great success among the staff and customers here at St.Petes. Now is our time to say bye-bye to our indicators and hello to our favorite drydropper rigs.

The different amount of bugs we also get to fish during this time is a delicacy and only comes 4 out of the 12 months a year. In order to get dialed in with those bugs, we highly suggest checking out one of our signature Entomology classes on the water. It's an awesome way to get familiar with bugs in the Poudre river and Big Thompson but a lot of what is in those two systems will be spread out along the Rockies.

We saw the Salmon Flies come and go but now we will be seeing our Golden Stones and Yellow Sallies, Pale Morning Duns, Terrestrials, Cad-

dis and the great Western Green Drakes. Our entomology class offers an introduction to these and much more in our local waters. The next session will be held on the water on Sunday, July 12. Just call us to sign up (970-498-8968.

Runoff/Highwater season is also when we tend to catch some of those bigger fish. They are out looking for other smaller fish to munch on. The way to imitate those is with big, ugly, heavy streamers. Because water is pushed up to the banks and it's a little harder to get a decent back cast, we will often turn to our trusty spey rods. Not only do they help turn over those big flies but most of the time we use this rod to make a forward cast without having to make a back cast first. It's a great tool to cover lots of water and overall, it's just fun.

Grant Houx will be hosting our Spey School on Saturday, July 11th. Here you will learn the ins and outs of spey casting with one the easiest going guys on the planet. Keep an eye out for some of our Euro Nymphing classes that we will have going on too! Euro Nymphing has been around for years but has recently exploded in the west due to it's easy learning curve and ability to round up fish.

Our next class for Euro Nymphing will be on July 18th and we have opened that up to reservations as well. Between classes, in store shopping, and asking questions we'll have just about everything you need to get out on the water. Take advantage of the time you get to do some of the best fishing we'll have for 2020.

We sure do miss seeing everyone's faces so please, stop by and chat with us. Don't be strangers, we are all in this together as a community. Times are tough but with enough perseverance we will all get through on the other side. We look forward to seeing you!
