#### **Back Cast**

The January 8 General Meeting was very interesting. The main talk was given by Steve Putman, the Regional Director of the CDOW. He outlined the current activities related to the Halligan Reservoir silt release and the burying of the first 2 plus miles of Phantom Canyon. He detailed the tragedy with slides and discussed the problem in the broader context of other silted reservoirs across the country, and the efforts to stop future such releases in Colorado. Current efforts are centered around a controlled release of 140cfs in the Spring to move the silt downstream through the irrigation

A special thanks to Brad Bishoff for his work in coordinating TU, Nature Conservancy, and State agency activities associated with the Halligan Reservoir disaster and keeping us informed. He is still looking for the remaining \$13,000 to fund the CSU silt study

system, thus bypassing the lower, less affected part of the Canyon. The State is also attempting to improve the coordination of its water and DOW activities, as a result of the disaster.

The membership, and subsequently the Board of Directors voted to donate \$1000 to a Colorado State University study that will focus on the silting deposition in the North Fork of the Poudre. If fully funded this study will be conducted by Professor Ellen Wohl. National TU's Cold Water Conservation Fund is also contributing \$5,000. Steve also discussed the state of whirling disease in the Big Thompson and the Poudre. Both have been infected for over a decade, yet the fish in the Big Thompson are reproducing and apparently healthy. Clearly we need more information about the disease. - Ken Eis

Ticket prices are \$25 per individual and \$40 per couple if purchased before February 15th, after that they go up \$5.00.


Please don't delay, make your plans now and join us in an evening of fun, camaraderie and conservation fund-raising. Remember, if we don't do it, who else will?


